How it works:

- 3. **Read!** Starting at the beginning of the list, read each weekly story individually or as a group.

- 5. **Discuss!** Use one or more of the questions listed below to discuss the stories. If you are doing this challenge solo, consider keeping a journal for reflection.
 - A. What is the story about? (Feel free to get creative! Retell the story in your own words, act it out, portray it via an artistic medium.)
 - B. What did you like best in the story? With whom did you identify?
 - C. How does this story connect with the previous one? Where do you see signs of God's covenant (promise or pledge) with God's people?
 - D. What does this story call you or your household to do as God's people?



Extra Bible Stories

Rest for the Land – Leviticus 25: 1-7

On Mount Sinai the Lord spoke to Moses and told him – "Tell the people of Israel that when y'all arrive in the promised land that I am giving to you, you can work the land. You can grow crops and vineyards and orchards with fruit and vegetables for six straight years. But on the seventh year – the land needs a break. The earth gets tired just like we do, and it needs to rest so it can restore itself and be ready to grow more food again later. During that year you can eat anything that just naturally grows on its own, but do not plant gardens or large fields of any kind. Give the earth a break."

Balaam & the Lord's Messenger – Numbers 22: 22-35
